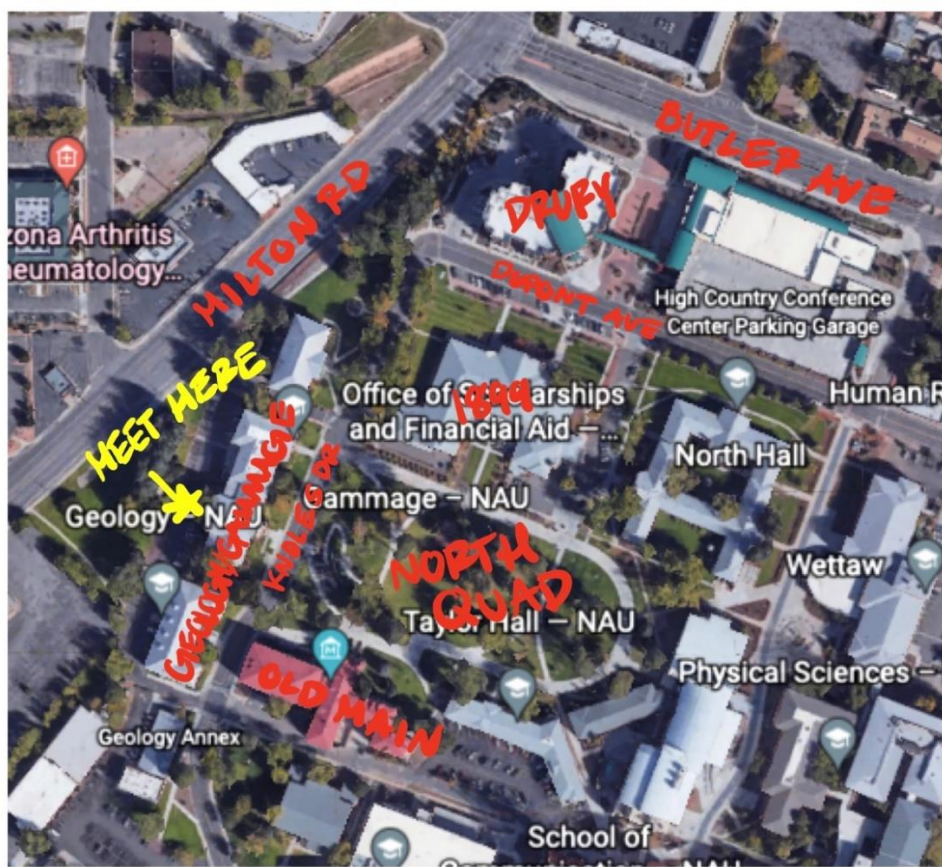

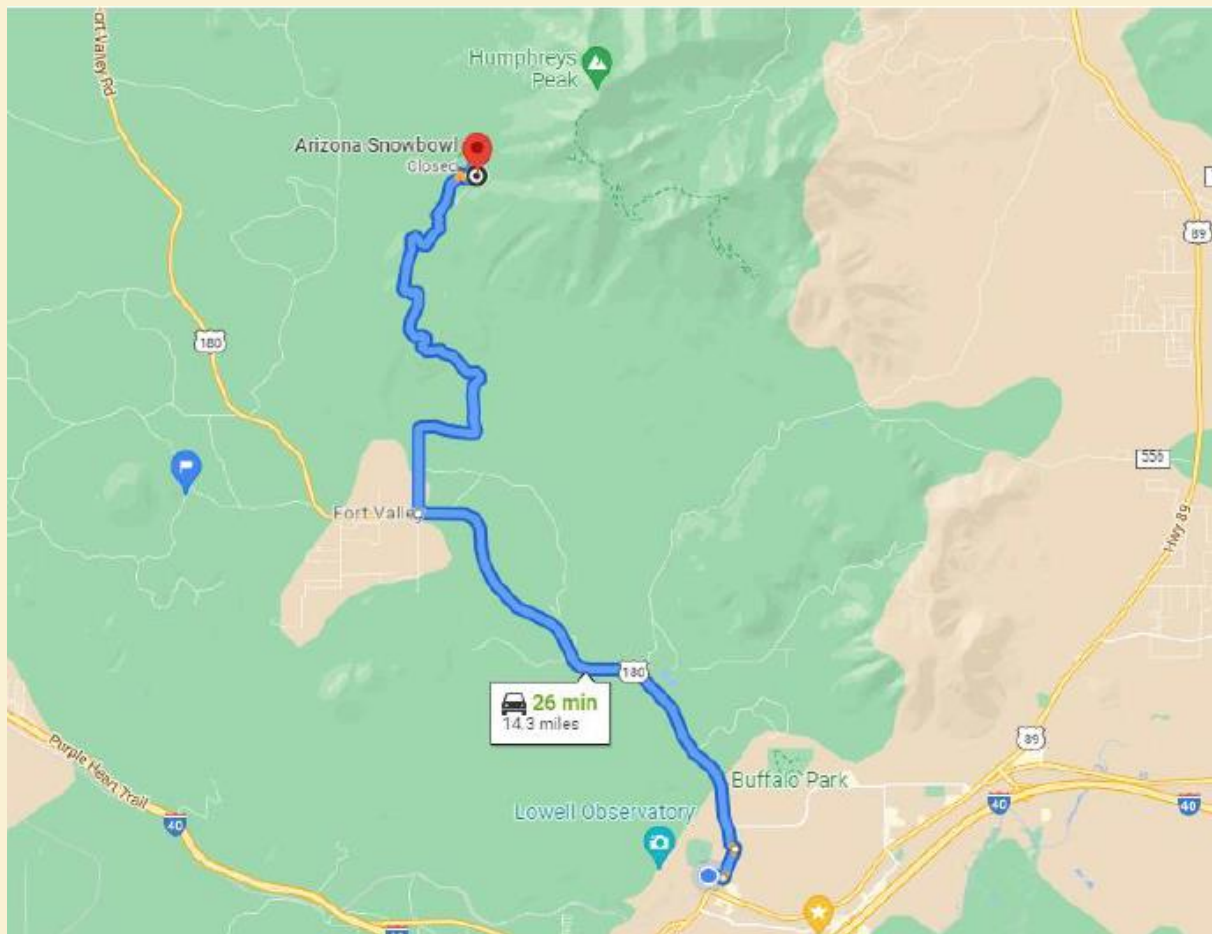
October's Club Cruise – Sun. Oct. 17
