

Directions - Flagstaff, AZ to Cottonwood, AZ 64 miles Via I-17 S, E Cornville Rd


- 1. Get onto on to I-17 S / AZ-89A S

- 5. 1.9 miles. Turn right onto N Main St
- 6. 1.2 miles. Arrive at N Main St

The last intersection before your destination is N 3rd St.
