In Memory of Cecil Gary

We were all saddened to learn of the passing of long-time member, Cecil Gary. Many of us attended Cecil's 90th birthday celebration and remember the many years he and his beloved wife Lela participated in club events, as well as their driving their '34 Ford around the country for other car events. Cecil Gary, age 91, was born March 12, 1930, to James and Ardella (Bonham) Gary, in Casa Grande, AZ. Cecil lived in Maricopa until 1943 on a 160-acre homestead of his fathers. He moved to Phoenix because of the war- World War II, where his father was employed by the Bureau of Reclamation. Cecil served two years in the United States Army during the Korean Conflict. He married Lela Davidson on March 30, 1953. They were married 68 years at the time of her passing in June 2021. They ran Davidson Hardware Store and Lumber Yard and an adjacent motel until retirement to Sedona. They also owned and operated multiple housing complexes. They enjoyed many cruises and visits to foreign countries. They retired to Sedona over 20 years ago. They attended Bethany Bible Church while in Phoenix and Rock of Ages Lutheran in Sedona. They enjoyed many hot rod runs with "Route 66 Car Club" and "Arizona Street Rod Association". Cecil started building hot rods with a 1931 Ford Model B. Currently he has a yellow 1934 Ford 5-window coupe, that they spent many days traveling all over the U.S. with great friends. Cecil is survived by one sister Elenora Dyer of Boise, ID. One niece, four nephews, and many grand-nieces and -nephews. Funeral Services and celebration of his life will be held on February 16, at 1:00 PM at A.L. Moore-Grimshaw Mortuary Bethany Chapel, 710 W Bethany Home Rd in Phoenix, AZ.

Thank you for your gift to the Flagstaff Family Food Center! This year, we are celebrating our 30th Anniversary. We are honored to have served our neighbors in need for the past 30 years - and we could not have done it without the help of supporters like you.

Over 30 years ago, local businessman and philanthropist *George McCullough* would give his business card to anyone on the street who needed some help and tell them to head over to the Grand Canyon Cafe for a hot meal and use his card as payment. At the end of the month, he would square up the bill with restaurant owners, Fred and Tina Wong. McCullough's generosity became well-known around Flagstaff and eventually evolved into a soup kitchen, first opened in the basement of his church. *More and more community members became drawn to the mission of feeding those in need, and on Christmas Day 1991, the Flagstaff Family Food Center officially opened its doors.* We have not missed a single hot meal at our Kitchen since that day.

As you know, the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic has hit our most vulnerable neighbors - including seniors, children, and hard-working individuals who have lost their jobs - especially hard. We have seen a sustained increase in the need for food assistance for the past year, and we expect that need to remain high for many months to come. As you can see, your support now means more than ever. *Together, we are providing over 3.5 million meals to families each year* - and helping our most vulnerable neighbors make it through these difficult times.




